To Bring: Horses, drinks, chairs & food

Costs: The USDA Forest Service charges \$10.00 per vehicle per day. Please pay at the pay

station at the entrance of the Valley View Campground and display receipt on rear

view mirror.

Route #1: Follow FM 730 north from Decatur for 9 miles and turn left on CR 2461 (by Cemetery & Cottonwood Lake signs); at the immediate fork, turn right on CR 2560 for 6 miles (proceed past the turn-off for Cottonwood Lake). Veer right at Y (by sign for Bethel Baptist Church – will be heading away from the church) on CR 2675 for 1.6 miles. Turn right on CR 2777 to Valley View.

Route #2: Follow U.S. Hwy 81/287 north of Decatur 11 miles. At Alvord, take BR 81/287 to intersection with FM 1655; turn right on FM1655 and go 8 miles; cross Montague County Line & go ½ mile; turn right on Roberts Road; follow Roberts Road 1.7 mile and turn left on CR 2690 for 1 mile; turn right on Parker Dairy Road; at 100 yards turn left on CR 2777 and follow to Valley View 1 mile on right.

The Facilities: 15 camp sites, a 20 X 40 pavilion, charcoal grill, and primitive restrooms. There is no electricity or running water. A windmill provides stock water. There are no pens for the horses - portable pens or picket lines can be used. The trails in this area of the park are sandy and are fine for unshod horses.
